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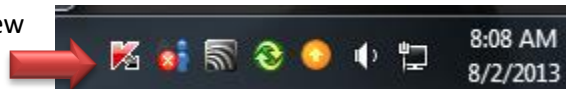
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Overview:

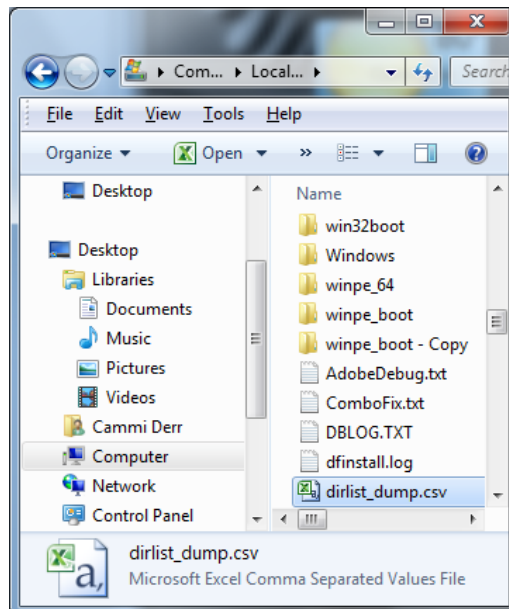
The information provided in this document describes the processes used by End Users to manage the Kaspersky Endpoint Security application on their local computer.

Once Kaspersky is installed, users will see and new icon in their system tray.



Scanning A File

1. Open Windows Explorer and navigate in the list of files in the directory.
2. Select the file to be scanned.

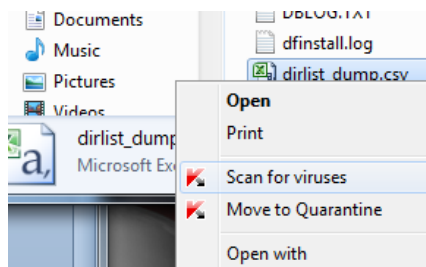


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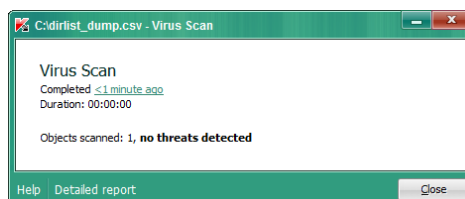
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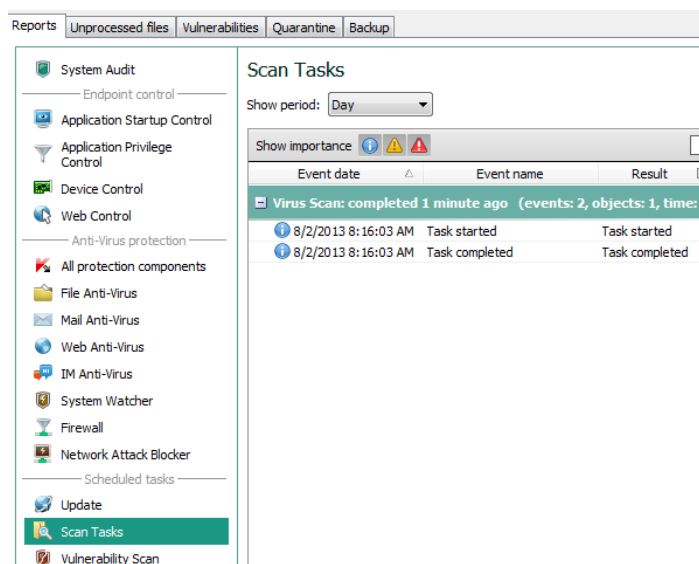
3. Right-click on the file and select **Scan for viruses**



4. Once the file is scanned, Kaspersky will display a message providing scanning details.



5. If the user would like to see a more detailed report, he or she can select **Detailed Report**



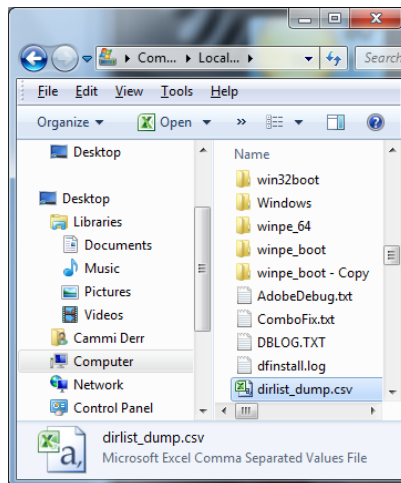
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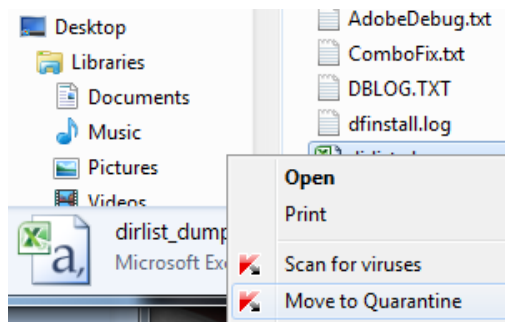
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Quarantining a File

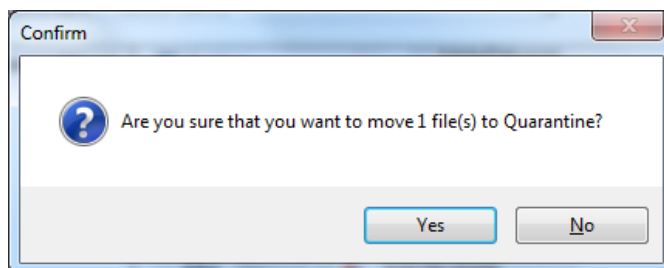
1. Open Windows Explorer and navigate in the list of files in the directory.
2. Select the file to be quarantined.



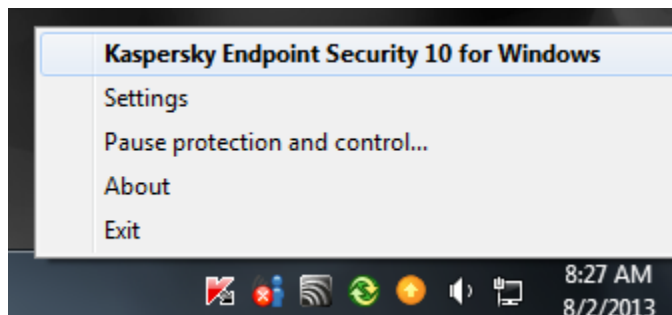
3. Right-click on the file and select **Move to Quarantine**



4. Click **Yes** to confirm to move the file to the quarantine.



5. To view the file in the Quarantine if desired, right-click on the icon in the system tray and select **Kaspersky Endpoint Security 10 for Windows**

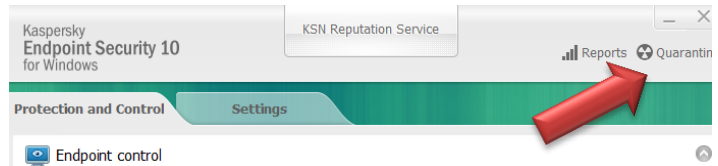


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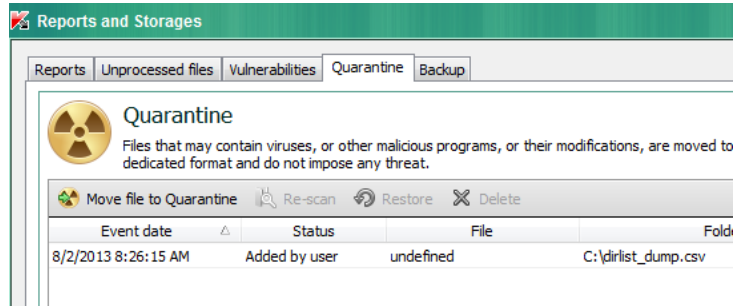
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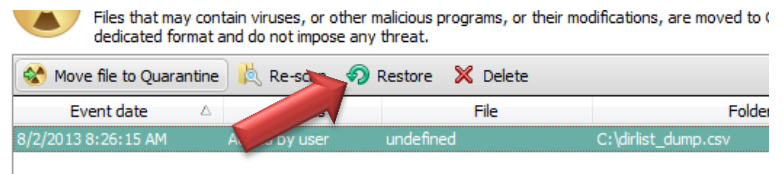
6. Select the **Quarantine** link



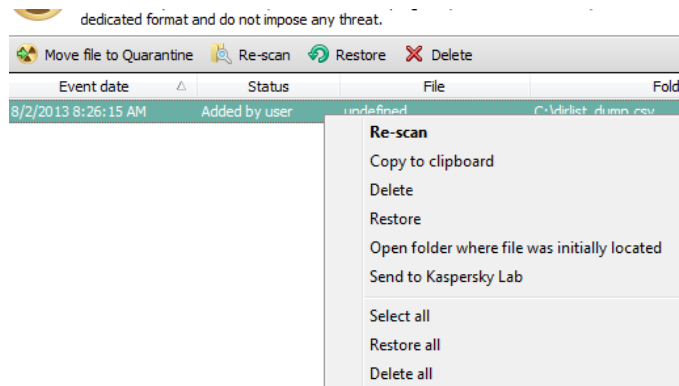
7. A windows will open to display the file(s) in the quarantine



8. If the user desires to move the file out of the quarantine back to the original location, click on the file and select **Restore**.
The file will be restored to its original location.



- Alternatively, the user may select the file or a group of files.
- Right-click when the mouse is hovering over the file(s).
- Select a task option from the fly-out menu to take a specific action.



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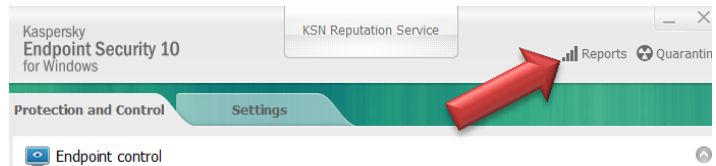
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Viewing Reports

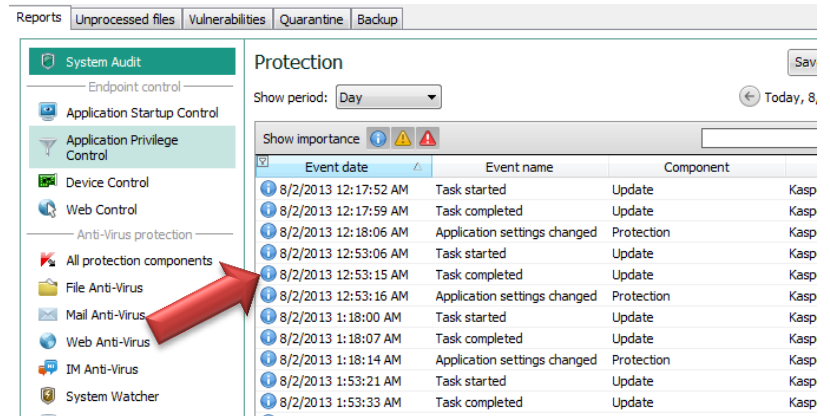
1. Right-click on the icon in the system tray and select **Kaspersky Endpoint Security 10 for Windows**



2. Click on the **Reports** option.



3. Select a report option in the left frame.
4. A list of reports will be displayed in the right frame.



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Common Messages

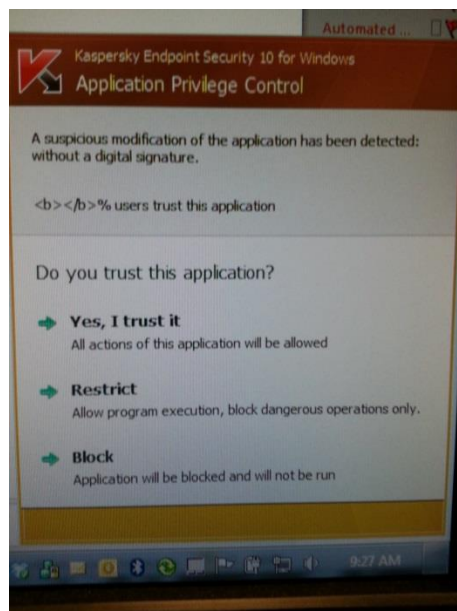
1. If you see a message pop up on the machine, this is a firewall message questioning if you would like to allow the application to run.

Your choices are:

“Yes, I trust it” – This will allow the application to run.

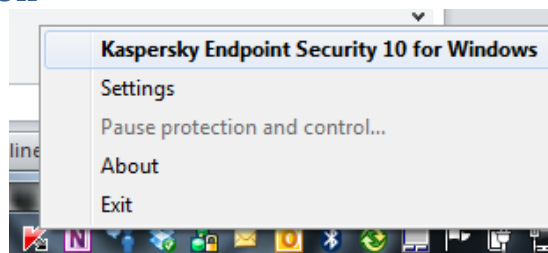
“Restrict” – Allow the program to execute, but block any dangerous operations associated with the application.

“Block” – Block the application which will not allow the application to run.



Changing the Restrictions of an Application

1. Right-click on the **Kaspersky** symbol in the system tray.
2. Click **Kaspersky Endpoint Security 10 for Windows**

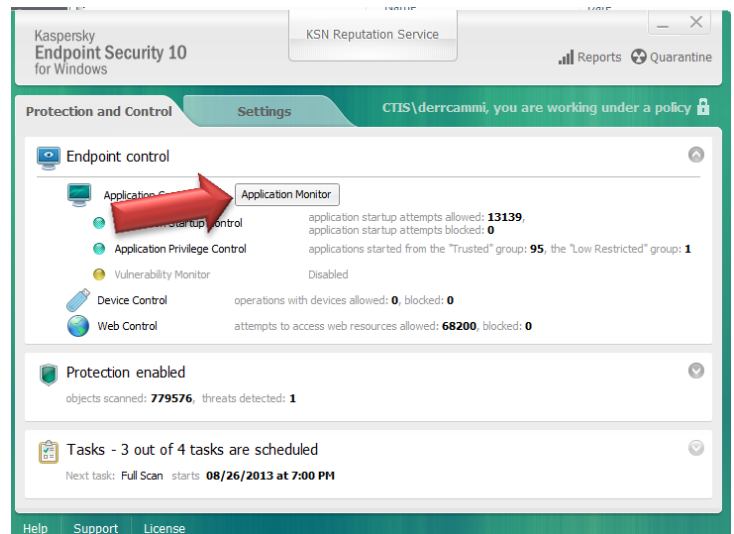


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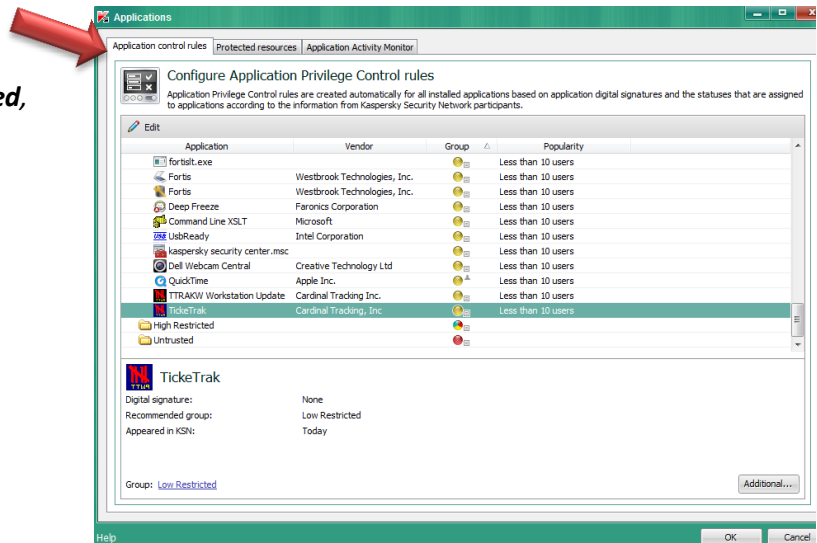
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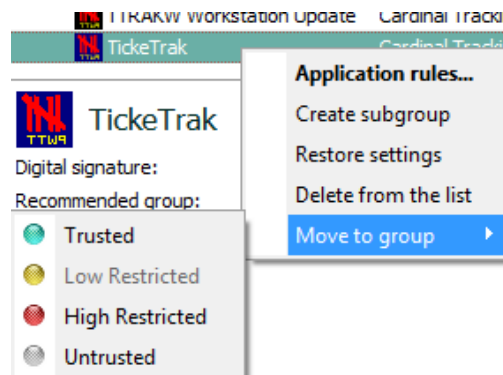
3. Click the **Application Monitor** button



4. Click the **Application control rules** tab.
5. Scroll in the list where the application might be located (**Trusted, Low Restricted, High Restricted, Untrusted**)



6. Right click on the application you would like to update.
7. Select **Move to group**
8. Select the group to add the application (**Trusted, Low Restricted, High Restricted, Untrusted**)



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9. Click **OK**
