- 1. Applicants must hold a valid Texas teaching certificate (or) successful scores on the ExCET/TExES exam (or) have a satisfactory score of the combined verbal and quantitative portions of the GRE.
- 2. Undergraduate grade point average must be 2.75 overall (or) 3.00 on the last 60 hours in the undergraduate program.

MASTERS COMPREHENSIVE EXAM

Students are required to take and pass a written comprehensive examination during the semester they graduate. Exams are given three times a year; fall, spring, and summer 1. It is important to apply during the very first week of your final semester. GRADUATION APPLICATION

Because the window to apply for graduation is extremely short, it is important to apply <u>during the first</u> <u>two weeks of the semester you plan to graduate</u>. Then update your degree plan and email it to your advisor who must have it to endorse your application for graduation.
