# SPED 346 - Introduction to Exceptional Children Summer 2 (2012) Online

Discussion contributions for each week are due by <u>Sunday evening at 11:59pm</u>.

**Drop-Box Assignments:** Each week you will have an assignment to submit to the drop-box. These assignments are due by <u>Sunday evening at 11:59pm</u>. Instructions for each week's drop-box assignment can be found under the "assignments" tab for each week.

**Quizzes:** Each week you will have a test. The weekly tests will cover all chapters that were covered that week. The weekly tests will be open for the entire week, but will close on **Sunday** evening at 11:59 PM of that week. You will only be allowed to take the tests once. These tests are open book, but are timed, so you will need to have a good general understanding of all the material in the chapters to be able to complete it in time.
