### **Course Information:**

### **-Presentation guidelines:**

a) Presentation 1-Extension Presentation

1) 5-8 minute presentation

2) On an area that you can give training or provide expertise

b) Presentation 2-Research Presentation

1) 8-10 minute presentation

2) Present article from a Peer-Reviewed Academic research journal in your field of expertise. This paper should be a single research project. Review papers are not accepted.

3) Turn in copy of your selected article (must be printed) one week before your scheduled presentation for approval.

4) Your Presentation should include the following:

i) Introduction

ii) Methods and Materials

iii) Results

#### iii)Discussion and Conclusion

- Critique sheets will be turned in with comments concerning other presentations. Comments should be constructive and positive.
- You will be assigned a review group. This group will compile comments and give to presenter at the end of the presentation day.
- The class will be divided into groups for the Socratic Seminar. The instructor will give a reading assignment prior to the scheduled seminar. During the seminar discussants will pose questions, make statements, form ideas and discuss the material in its entirety.

### **Class Attendance Policy**

Attendance is mandatory for AG 400. Roll will be taken each time AG 400 meets. If you are not present to answer roll call you will be given an unexcused absence. Each student is allowed 2 absences during the semester; unexcused absences will count against your critique sheet grade.
