John Sharp, M.P.A. Chancellor, The Texas A&M University System

John Sharp was appointed chancellor of The Texas A&M University System by the Board of Regents on September 6, 2011. As chancellor, Sharp leads one of the nation's largest university systems, which has an annual budget of \$6.3 billion. Enrollment at the A&M System's 11 universities and health science center has grown to more than 151,000, and externally funded research expenditures are in excess of \$1 billion.

Sharp brings with him more than three decades of public service. He came to the A&M System from Ryan & Company, where he was a principal with the largest state and local tax consulting firm of its kind in Texas. He earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science from Texas A&M University in

1972, where he was a member of the Corps staff of the Corps of Cadets and was elected student body president. Upon graduation, he was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the United States Army Reserves. He belongs to American Legion.

In 1976, Sharp received a master's degree in public administration from Southwest Texas State University while working full-time with the Legislative Budget Board in Austin. In 1978, he opened a one-man real estate firm in Victoria, Texas, and became a successful small business owner.

That same year he was elected to the Texas House of Representatives and was named "Outstanding Freshman" by Texas Monthly. He won a seat in the Texas Senate in 1982, where he served on the powerful Senate Finance Committee, and was elected to the Texas Railroad Commission in 1986.

Sharp was elected state comptroller in 1990 and re-elected in 1994. When he took office, he quickly began working to fulfill his pledge to "make government work more like our most successful businesses." Eight years later, he reinvented Texas state government and turned it into a high-quality, low-cost customer service operation that has saved taxpayers billions, helped avert a state income tax and served as a model around the world.

Dr. Mark Rudin, President, Texas A&M University-Commerce

Dr. Mark Rudin was appointed President of Texas A&M University-Commerce by The Texas A&M University System Board of Regents on August 16, 2018. Dr. Rudin has a Bachelor of General Health Science (1983), Master of Science in Health Physics (1985), and Doctor of Philosophy in Medicinal Chemistry with a Concentration in Health Physics (1989) from Purdue University.

Student success, expanded research, and economic development are among Dr. Rudin's top priorities as President. His vision for A&M-Commerce includes adapting traditional models to meet the needs of all students and providing skills development in preparation for post-graduation employment.

Prior to assuming the presidency at A&M-Commerce, Dr. Rudin served as the Vice President for Research and Economic Development at Boise State University.

During his eleven-year tenure at Boise State, he played a central role in expanding research activity and developing collaborative partnerships with both public and private entities.

Dr. Rudin previously served at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas in a variety of administrative roles before being named Interim Vice President for Research and Graduate Dean. He also served as a Technical/ Administrative Assistant with the U.S. Department of Energy and as a Senior Program Specialist/Project Engineer with EG&G Idaho, Inc. Dr. Rudin's career in education began in Idaho where he served as an instructor in the Department of Health Physics at Idaho State University.

Eric Hale 2020 National Urban School Teacher 2021 Texas Teacher of the Year

Texas A&M University-Commerce alumnus Eric Hale is one of Texas's most talented and influential teachers. Named the 2021 Texas State Teacher of the Year, Hale is making a life-changing impact on Texas children and the field of education.

Mr. Hale teaches first and second grades at David G. Burnet Elementary School in Dallas. Designated as a Texas master teacher, his holistic teaching approach empowers students educationally, emotionally and socially to thrive in a global society.

This year, Hale made history as Texas's first Black man to be named Teacher of the Year. He was also the first Black man to represent Texas at the 2021 National Teacher of the Year awards.

In 2020, he was named Teacher of the Year for Dallas ISD. In 2019, he received the Queen Smith Award, recognizing him as the nation's top urban elementary school teacher.

Hale has been recognized for his accomplishments on multiple television shows and news publications, including the NBC News special "Inspiring America," NBC Nightly News with Lester Holt, The Today Show, The Kelly Clarkson Show, Access Hollywood and The Washington Post.

Born into poverty, Hale endured years of abuse and trauma until an influential teacher in his seventh-grade class helped him discover his self-worth. Hale believes his purpose is to advocate and fight for kids who are facing the same type of childhood he experienced.

Hale earned a Bachelor of Science in organizational leadership from Wright State University in Ohio. He later received an alternative teaching certificate and Master of Education in educational administration from A&M-Commerce.

The Academic Costume

Origins

The origins of academic dress date back to the 12th and 13th centuries when universities were taking form. The ordinary dress of the scholar, whether student or teacher was the dress of the cleric. Long gowns were worn and may have been necessary for warmth in unheated buildings. Hoods seem to have served to cover the tonsured (shaved) head until superseded for that purpose by the skull cap.

In 14th century England, certain colleges prescribed the wearing of a long gown and forbade "excess" in apparel. In the days of Henry VIII, Oxford and Cambridge first began prescribing a definite academic dress and made it a matter of university control.

The assignment of colors to signify certain faculties was a later development, standardized in the United States in the 19th century. White, taken from the fur trimming of Oxford and Cambridge, was assigned to arts and letters. Red, one of the traditional colors of the church, went to theology. Green, the color of medieval herbs, was adopted for medicine. Golden yellow, symbolizing the wealth produced by scientific research, was assigned to the sciences.

Unlike European institutions, American colleges and universities opted for a definite system that all might follow. A commission from leading universities was established in 1893 to devise a suitable system of academic apparel. Meeting at Columbia University in 1895, the commission adopted a code of academic dress regulating the cut and style of the gowns and prescribing the colors which were to represent the different fields of learning.

Gowns

Academic gowns or robes in the U.S. usually have similar characteristics. The gown for the bachelor's degree has pointed sleeves and is designed to be worn closed. The master's degree gown has a short, oblong sleeve, open at the wrist and may be worn open or closed. The gown for the doctor's degree has bell-shaped sleeves and is usually worn closed.

With some exceptions gown are black and those for the bachelor's and master's degrees are untrimmed. For the doctor's degree, the gown is paneled down the front with velvet and three bars of velvet are used across the sleeves. These panels are crossbars may be black or in velvet of the color distinctive of the discipline to which the degree pertains.

Colors

For all academic purposes, including trimmings of doctors' gowns, edging of hoods, and tassels of caps, colors of some of the different disciplines are as follows: Arts, Letters, Humanities—White; Commerce, Accountancy, Business—Brown; Dentistry—Lavender; Education—Light Blue; Law—Purple; Music—Pink; Philosophy—Dark Blue; Science—Golden Yellow. The dark blue of the Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) degree is used to represent the mastery of the discipline of learning and scholarship in any field and is not intended to represent the field of philosophy.

Hoods

All hoods are black and are rarely worn for the bachelor's degree. Doctor's degree hoods are slightly longer than those for master's degrees and have panels at the sides. All hoods are lined with the official color or colors of the college or university conferring the degree. The binding or edging on hoods, wider on the doctor's degree, is indicative of the subject to which the degree pertains.

Caps

Most academic caps are black and of a material matching the gown. For the doctor's degree only, velvet may be worn. Traditionally, mortarboards have been standard academic regalia, although a soft cap resembling a beret may be worn. The tassel of the doctor's cap is usually gold in color, while the bachelor's and master's are black. The tassel is fastened to the middle point of the top of the cap and lies as it will thereon. At most institutions, including Texas A&M University-Commerce, the tassel is worn on the left side.
