




# NEW FRESHMAN APPLIED ADMITTED & ENROLLED BY GENDER Fall 2016




## **SAT/ACT COMPARISON FOR ENROLLED STUDENTS**



#### **OVERALL HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT**




## **ENROLLMENT BY DEMOGRAPHIC**




## ENROLLMENT BY RESIDENCY Fall 2016


