- I'm happy to report enrollment numbers look great for ACUE and Investing in Us. I'm delighted to see so many of you taking advantage of these great opportunities. As one of the A&M University System campuses participating in the Scaling Instructional Excellence for Student Success Initiative, our institution has certified 56 faculty in Effective Teaching Practices, credentialed over 100 course participants, and has about 60 people registered for ACUE. For Investing in Us, we currently have over 250 faculty, staff, and alumni registered for this fall's variety of interesting courses. Thank you to the faculty teaching these courses, and to Dr. Laura Isbell and Dr. Carrie Klypchak for directing and organizing these opportunities and continued dedication to our institution.
- Our new Artificial Intelligence Initiative has been working hard on gathering useful resources and setting up workshops.
