Teaching

Regularly taught all **psychological statistics** courses, at both undergraduate and graduate levels, in the department at Fort Hays. Also offered content area courses in *perception* and *cognition* (with emphasis upon applied memory and decision making). Taught a variety of other topical (e.g., *Sport Psychology*) courses during the 34 years at Fort Hays State.

I am currently teaching (or have taught) 6 different on-line graduate level psychology courses for Texas A&M University-Commerce (*Psych & Ed Statistics*, *Intermediate Statistics*, *Multivariate Statistics*, *Research Methodology*, *History & Systems of Psychology*, and *Ethics in Organizations*).

Directed 70 completed MS Theses/Ed.S. Field Studies at Fort Hays State between 1971-2004 and served on roughly 60% of all other thesis/Field Study committees within the department during this time.

Author and co-author of 55 papers and published abstracts which have appeared in printed form from 1965 to the present.
