HOUSING


Choose from one of our **11 residence halls** organized into three styles: traditional dorms, suites and apartments.


- **9 Grab your friends and play** video games, board games, pool or watch your favorite shows in our TV lounges.



ADMISSION

1 Submit Application

Visit ApplyTexas.org and choose Texas A&M University-Commerce.

2 Submit Official Transcript(s)

FRESHMAN: Submit complete high school transcript through your junior year. Class rank and GPA will be used for scholarship purposes. Dual-credit students must also submit an official transcript from the institution that offered the dual-credit classes.

INTERNATIONAL: Transcript(s) must be evaluated by an independent credential evaluation agency before A&M-Commerce will consider your application for admission. This evaluation must show that your high school diploma is equivalent to a U.S. high school diploma and must include class rank and GPA if available. Class rank and GPA will be used for scholarship purposes.

3 Submit Test Scores

FRESHMAN: Use the codes 4088 ACT and 6188 SAT **INTERNATIONAL:** Language proficiency scores and proof of financial support

4 Apply for Financial Aid

Submit your application through FAFSA.gov (TASFA: CollegeForAllTexans.com). Use the **A&M-Commerce code 003565**.
