ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Each applicant must first apply and meet general requirements of the Graduate School.

1. Applicants must hold a valid Texas teaching certificate (or) successful scores on the TExES exam (or) have a satisfactory score of the combined verbal and quantitative portions of the GRE.
2. Previous coursework (undergraduate or graduate) grade point average must be 2.75 overall or 2.75 on the last 60 hours.

MASTERS COMPREHENSIVE EXAM

Students are required to take and pass a written comprehensive examination during the semester they graduate. Exams are given three times a year; fall, spring, and summer 1. It is important to apply during the very first week of your final semester.
