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OVERVIEW

The Masters of Social Work (MSW) program at Texas A&M-Commerce is designed to meet the educational needs of future social workers. The program prepares students for advanced generalist social work practice which will enable them to engage in direct practice, advocacy, supervision, administration, and demonstrating leadership in various contexts. Upon completion of our MSW program, students should effectively demonstrate competencies such as critical thinking, independent decision-making, and application of evidence-based interventions, promotion of equality and social justice, and evaluation of practice. In order to accommodate working adults, courses are scheduled on various days with evening classes, at different locations or 100% online. To apply, visit Apply Texas at https://goapplytexas.org/.

PROGRAM ADMISSION OPTIONS

Options for admission to the Social Work Program include:

- 1. <u>Foundation</u> Students with an undergraduate degree in any field other than Social Work. This is either a full time, two-year program offered over four regular semesters and one summer semester or a part-time program in which students can expect to earn their degree in about four years. Students beginning the program in the fall or spring term can choose the full time program and students beginning in the summer term must select the part-time program.
- 2. Advanced Standing (AGP/Concentration) Students who have earned a Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) degree from a program accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) within the last six years and have a 3.0 GPA are eligible for expedited admission to the Advanced Standing Program. Students with a BSW older than 6 years, from a CSWE accredited program may apply to the Advanced Standing program, but may be required to take additional course work to update knowledge, skills and abilities as recommended by the Admissions Committee. Full-time students can expect to complete the program in one year.



FAQs MSW Admission Process

- 1. What is the admission process for the MSW program?
 - a. The online application https://goapplytexas.org/ is automatically sent to the Graduate School who will receive within 72 hours. You will receive an email from Dayla Burgin in the Graduate School with instructions.
 - b. Once the admission file is complete with the Graduate School, Leanne Farquhar, MSW Coordinator emails the student confirmation their file has been submitted to the Admissions Committee for review and a final decision. If accepted, a link for orientation and request for five forms (Orientation Acknowledgement, Code of Conduct, Degree Plan, Comprehensive Exam Info, and Permit) must be returned.
 - c. Once documents are received, the student will be given permits to register.
- How long does the admissions process take?
 It depends on how long it takes for all necessary admission materials to be submitted. Once a student's file is complete, sent to Admissions Committee (active Social Work professors), it can take up to two weeks for the Committee to reach a decision.
- 3. Should I send my admission materials to the School of Social Work or to the Graduate School? ALL admission materials must be sent to Dayla Burgin in the Graduate School at Dayla.Burgin@tamuc.edu or mail originals to TAMUC, Graduate School, Dayla Burgin, P.O. Box 3011, Commerce, TX 75429-3011.
- 4. If my file is complete and I've been accepted into the MSW program, but I've decided to postpone my admission, do I have to reapply to the program?
 No, your file will remain active for one calendar year. If you wait over one year, you will not need to pay your fee again, but will still need to reapply thru Apply Texas. You will also need current references, new professional narrative, updated resume, and SW info form.
- If I haven't paid my application fee yet, can I still register after I've been accepted and attended orientation?
 No, the application fee has to be paid to register.

- 1. Describe the development of your interest in the field of social work.
- 2. What are your personal qualifications for social work practice?
- Express your feelings, experience, and ideas about working with diverse and oppressed populations.
- 4. Discuss any social experiences or personal situations that had a significant impact on you. How did these experiences contribute to your understanding of your values/beliefs/etc.?
- Discuss your ability to establish positive helping relationships & ability to make professional judgments.
- What are your expectations of graduate education? Describe the knowledge and skills you hope to gain.
- Describe your strengths and learning needs that may affect your professional practice in the social work field.
- Have you ever been charged and/or convicted of a misdemeanor or felony?
